### November Council Report

This month Council met on the 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday so that Rev Do Young could attend the meeting following his visit as a delegate from SA to the Presbyterian Church of South Korea (PROK).

No new initiatives were raised or discussed at our meeting. Rather we reflected on what had been accomplished since this Council took office last March and began to consider the way forward for 2023.

Through the past month attention has been paid to resolving the ongoing care of the garden and supporting the Property Committee in their efforts to deal with minor handyman repairs. The wall in the church porch has not yet dried out sufficiently for the salt damp repairs to be completed. Because the Hall is being well used we have to be alert to ongoing maintenance requirements. Thanks to our team of handy people (Brenton, Meng, Richard) and our cleaner Amir, who are working behind the scenes to keep our buildings and grounds in good repair.

One highlight of the month was our hosting of the ecumenical service on Christ the King Sunday, 22 November, at 7pm. Fellow Christians from local Anglican, Catholic, Lutheran, Churches of Christ and UC congregations joined with us to celebrate our Lord. Thanks to Dana and Sue who provided a supper. It was a cold wet night

and the hot soup was just what was needed.

It was decided that through January we would continue our usual worship in the Church unless it gets really hot. We have guidelines to follow to help decide when it will be too hot to stay in the Church, in which case we will move into the Hall for the Service.

Matters to be dealt with in planning for 2023 include what kind of social activities we would like to have through the year, how best to improve our care for each other and what outreach initiatives we should focus on.

A full report of Council activities will be presented at the Annual General Meeting on the 6<sup>th</sup> December.

Our final meeting for the year in December, will be a Christmas celebration.

We thank you for your support throughout 2022. Our next meeting in January will be as a newly elected Council.

## The Celebration of Christmas

At Christmas we commemorate the birth of our Saviour Jesus Christ, as both a religious and cultural celebration among billions of people around the world.

For us as Christians the birth of the baby at Christmas and death and resurrection of God as man at Easter are central to our faith. Christmas is preceded by the season of Advent, which we at PRUC celebrate by the lighting of candles.

Advent initiates the season of Christmastide which in the 'West' is a period of 12 days...There is a song the 12 days of Christmas. Christmas Day is a public holiday in many countries celebrated both religiously by us Christians, as well as culturally by many non-Christians, and forms an integral part of the commercial holiday season organized around it.

Here in Australia Christmas is celebrated as a family day, a happy holiday, a family get together with presents. The actual birth day of Jesus, the day we should celebrate with Him and give Him presents isn't known. Historians tell us that He was probably born some where between 7 years and 2 years Before the Christian Era, BCE. 
Get your cameras ready for the Summer Photo Competition!
